Looking farther down the road, planning has begun in earnest for the 2023 Capital City Century to be held Saturday, September 9, 2023, so save the date. And get ready for the century by riding the Sangamon Cycling Series, which tentatively starts with a ride from Sherman on May 13 followed by rides from Chatham on June 24, and on July 22 and August 12, with those last locations yet to be determined.

Finally, this year the Springfield Bicycle Club is working with the Springfield Triathlon Club to assist them in putting on the Kids Triathlon on July 15, 2023, at Lincoln Park, with the outdoor Nelson Center Pool as the venue for the swim. This is a fantastic event for kids from 5-13 years old, so we're thrilled to help potential future SBC members get pedaling.

What's Going on in the SBC?

Sangamon Cycling Series Updates

Registration for the third annual Sangamon Cycling Series is planned to go live on April 1, with the first event tentatively scheduled for May 13th in Sherman Park. Lori Dale is working with the Sherman Park District to make this happen. Subsequent dates will be June 24 from Chatham Community Park, July 22 and August 12 from either Rochester Community Park, Lake Sangchris or Centennial Park.

CCC Updates

A planning meeting was held on January 11 at Harvest Market. The meeting was well attended, and attendees split into smaller groups to discuss options for venue, food, and routes. A vote was taken and the decision was made to stick with a Saturday event. Prior to 2020, the CCC was held on the first Sunday after Labor Day. It was acknowledged that moving the event to Saturday has been a source of some controversey, but the rationale is that Sunday can be a day of recovery for those who tackle the longer distances, as well as a day of travel for the out-of-towners.

Kids Triathlon Updates

The SBC is collaborating with the Springfield Triathlon Club to plan the 2023 Kids' Triathlon. This event is held at Lincoln Park, with the swim in the Nelson Center Pool. Patty Shafer, the primary contact and coordinator for this event, has been busy with the preliminary tasks that include submitting a permit to the Springfield Parks District and reaching out to the main sponsors --- Scheels and HSHS Children's Hospital --- to confirm their support for this year.

Gravel Season

The 2023 gravel season kicks off with two SBC travels events --- the Dirty South Roubaix in Alto Pass, IL on March 4, followed by the SBC Travels event, the Dirty Assumption, on the following weekend. Monday Night Gravel (MNG) will start up on March 13, weather permitting. Troy Gilmore will be leading this evening ride. The starting location will shift to Loami Park, which will offer some drier conditions. Saturday gravel rides are in the planning process and will include a variety of starting locations and routes. Member Profile

Byron Nesbitt



Introduction

If you've ridden in the Capital City Century, chances are you've met Byron Nesbitt. He's been a member of the Springfield Bicycle Club since 1971 and although he no longer lives in the Springfield area, he returns each year to ride in the CCC.

History with the SBC

Byron has been a member of the SBC since its inception in mid 1971 and helped club founder Dorothy Doering and others get the club in motion. Back then Byron sported a very cool large handlebar mustache and was definitely one of the club's most active riders. He was cutting fast laps in Washington Park long before indexed shifting, clipless pedals, helmets and lycra clothing. On any given day Byron could be found powering his way around the park on a now classic Peugeot PX-10 bike wearing wool cycling shorts with genuine chamois skin padding. Toe clips, straps and nail on cleats were the order of the day, and Byron's Peugeot equipped with Stronglight equipment was as good as it got back in the day. Rich Huelskoetter hadn't yet opened his shop, R&M Cyclery, so Byron and other serious riders had to travel to shops near St. Louis to obtain decent cycling equipment.

As family responsibilities gradually took on greater importance, Byron took a few years off from active club membership and spent his available time coaching and supporting his children's sports teams. However, he never let go of that 'ol Peugeot and returned to active club status as soon as his children became older and more independent.

Cycling Background and Anecdotes

In 1963, Byron acquired his first "adult" bicycle --- a lime green Schwinn Sierra with a triple chainring.

Byron was an 18-year-old freshman at Colorado State University.

"In 1966 and 1969, before and after my Navy years, I dabbled with bike racing around the Midwest. I was racing on a full Campy Frejus purchased from the iconic Oscar Wastyn bike shop in Chicago. During that time I was able to borrow a track bike from a friend. I used it to compete at outdoor velodromes at Northbrook and St. Louis. It was a Schwinn Paramount that he had purchased from Jim Rossi who had won the US Natl Championships on it. I never could get that bike as fast that Jim Rossi could-I was an average racer, at best."

"I rode 11 RAGBRAI's between 2000-2014 with a varied mix of SBC folks and labeled ourselves as Team Krazy Fokkers. I was known as "Big Fokker".

"In 1979 many of us in the SBC hosted the Midwest Tandem Rally for the first time. Dave and Deb Ringland chaired and organized the efforts. They were assisted with Judy and me as well as Carolyn and Dr. Dave Riesenberger. The three couples lived on the same street in Chatham and were tandem biking couples at the time. Many other SBC members volunteered many hours for the long weekend!"

Current bikes owned include a Trek hybrid and two Kona hardtail mountain bikes. He has participated in a half dozen trips with other SBC members, mountain biking at Moab and St. George, Utah. One of these trips included a 3-day, 2 night 100-mile ride on the White Rim Trail.

Personal / Family

Byron graduated from SSU/UIS in 1974 with a BA History. He retired from Bowser-Morner and moved from the Springfield area to Greenville, South Carolina, in 2015. Family includes five grandkids-Sara, Devin, Kai, Danae, Leo and three great-grandkids

Current Status



Byron's favorite type of riding is singletrack mountain biking in Pisgah National Forest and DuPont State Forest.

Byron currently rides about 125 days a year and also hikes 60+ days/year. Living so close to the world-class mountain biking trails systems of Pisgah National Forest and DuPont State Forest, is it any surprise that single track mountain biking is his favorite type of riding?

Byron continues to return to the CCC each year and he also skis with the Springfield Ski Club. Plans are in the works for a January ski trip in Whitefish, MT. He likes to stop in at the Alamo Blue Mondays when visiting Springfield.

If you see Byron at the 2023 Capital City Century, be sure to thank him for his long term support of the club and see if you can keep up with him!



Ride Classifications

▲ 18.1-20.0+ MPH AVERAGE SPEED.

These rides are for extremely strong and competitive cyclists with expert bike handling skills. Expect cyclists to be self-sufficient, and able to maintain speeds of 19+ mph for extended distances using pace-lines and other faster riding skills.

rides are for strong, experienced cyclists with considerable group riding experience. Expect the emphasis to be on improving individual stamina and riding skills. Cyclists will not feel obligated to wait for slower riders. Many times, pace-lines are common in group riding. Cyclists should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical repairs and should be comfortable navigating by map or GPS computer if separated from the group.

C 14.1-16.0 MPH AVERAGE SPEED. These rides are for competent cyclists with basic safety and bike handling skills. These rides combine social riding with improving fitness and riding ability. Expect that most cyclists will ride in groups. There may be rest stops on the route, but they

will be limited. Cyclists should be comfortable navigating by map if separated from the group and should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical problems

SLOW C 12.1-14.0 MPH AVG

SPEED. These rides are for competent cyclists with basic safety and bike handling skills. These rides combine social riding with improving fitness and riding ability. Expect that most cyclists will ride in groups. There may be rest stops on the route, but they will be limited. Cyclists should be comfortable navigating by map if separated from the group and should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical problems

D 10.0-12.0 MPH AVERAGE SPEED. These rides are for novice or recreational cyclists. These rides will have rest stops as needed. Expect the ride leader or another club member to sweep (stay with) the slowest cyclist. Assistance from the ride leader will be provided for flats and other minor mechanical problems.

EZ UNDER 10 MPH AVERAGE SPEED.

These rides are purely social. Expect shorter routes either in town or on

a trail and expect to ride together as a single group. No one will be dropped out of the back of the group. Assistance from the ride leader will be provided for flats and other minor mechanical problems.

GR GRAVEL. Route will be gravel, dirt or rough roads that are unsuitable for traditional road bikes.

MTB MOUNTAIN BIKE. Route will be on mountain bike trail system, typically singletrack.

NC NON-CYCLING EVENTS. No bikes required for these events.

The direction we head depends on who shows up and which direction the wind is blowing. This ride will start in APRIL, weather permitting For more info, contact Dave Ross at (217) 416-1682	5:30 PM GR Monday Night Gravel. WEATHER PERMITTING, meet at either Centennial Park or Loami Park for a 15-20 mile ride. Lights recommended early in season.
