CLUB INITIATIVES

Gravel Series Being Planned

Casey Primm is coordinating a series of gravel rides for the 2024 season, to include several local non-club rides and a potential "race" to cap the year off.

The Program formerly known as the D-Railers

A planning meeting took place on October 26th. In attendance were Bob Coady, Libby Shawgo, Jen Rockwell, Casey Primm, Amanda Rose, Mike Murphy and Anne Schroll. The program, which will kick off in the spring of 2024, will correlate initially with the Sangamon Cycling Series. The goal of the program is to help cyclists who are new to the club and/or new to group riding find fellow riders and ultimately participate in the Capital City Century in September. Stay tuned for updates.

2024 Capital City Century

Date/Venue: Speaking of the Capital City Century, the date has been chosen for next year's ride. The date will be Saturday, September 14 and the venue will again be the Sherman Athletic Club. Pushing the date back by a week allows for use of the boulevard through the Village of Williamsville and avoids conflict with traffic from Williamsville's Autumn on the Boulevard Festival, which is scheduled for September 7th.

Routes: Distances available will be the 12-mile family ride, and 20-, 40-, 63- and 100-mile road routes. The 125-mile and the groad routes will not be offered in 2024.

Registration Options: Registration will be handled through BikeSignUp. New for 2024 will be an option to register at a discounted rate and purchase a t-shirt separately. Plans are also in the works to offer a jersey.

Online: We're working on a new website for the CCC and hope to have it published by the end of the year.




OCTOBER 21

From the Archives

The Quick Release newsletter has been around for nearly as long as the SBC. Many issues are in digital form and are available for viewing on the club's website under the tab "SBC News". Following are some random snippets from over the years.

15 YEARS - NOVEMBER 2008
In the minutes from the September board meeting, Legislative/Education Director Bill Donels reported that U.S. Senator Dick Durbin had tagged \$315,000 for grading and paving of the InterUrban Trail.

Roger Schnelten reported on the 30th Annual Oktoberfest. R&M Cyclery donated a \$50 gift certificate to that shop, which was won by Shirene Thomas. The SBC and the Springfield Ski Club made donations to the event, which helped defray the substantial costs involved with hosting this event.

20 YEARS - NOVEMBER 2003
Several members of the SBC were recognized for donating to the blood bank.

First Lady Brenda Edgar presented club member John Werthwein with the State Employees Reach Out Recognition Program for his volunteer activities with the Illinois Rails to Trails Conservancy.

45 YEARS - NOVEMBER 1978
From Mike Becker's Memories:
David Ringland picked up an award at the Hilly Hundred for having ridden the farthest to get there of the 1500 participants. If four more SBC members had gone, the SBC would have been recognized as having sent the most members. The 43 that were there had a great time.

From Mike Becker's Memories:
The month's meeting was an installation of officers dinners at a wiener roast and pot luck.

On October 7, the first Bob Myers Century Ride was held with a registration fee of \$3.50. **That ride grew into today's Capital City Century.**

Bob Myers' Century Ride, with John
Danser as Chair, was held. This ride is
now known as the Capital City Century.



Ride Classifications

▲ 18.1-20.0+ MPH AVERAGE SPEED.

These rides are for extremely strong and competitive cyclists with expert bike handling skills. Expect cyclists to be self-sufficient, and able to maintain speeds of 19+ mph for extended distances using pace-lines and other faster riding skills.

rides are for strong, experienced cyclists with considerable group riding experience. Expect the emphasis to be on improving individual stamina and riding skills. Cyclists will not feel obligated to wait for slower riders. Many times, pace-lines are common in group riding. Cyclists should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical repairs and should be comfortable navigating by map or GPS computer if separated from the group.

C 14.1-16.0 MPH AVERAGE SPEED. These rides are for competent cyclists with basic safety and bike handling skills. These rides combine social riding with improving fitness and riding ability. Expect that most cyclists will ride in groups. There may be rest stops on the route, but they

will be limited. Cyclists should be comfortable navigating by map if separated from the group and should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical problems

SLOW C 12.1-14.0 MPH AVG

SPEED. These rides are for competent cyclists with basic safety and bike handling skills. These rides combine social riding with improving fitness and riding ability. Expect that most cyclists will ride in groups. There may be rest stops on the route, but they will be limited. Cyclists should be comfortable navigating by map if separated from the group and should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical problems

D 10.0-12.0 MPH AVERAGE SPEED. These rides are for novice or recreational cyclists. These rides will have rest stops as needed. Expect the ride leader or another club member to sweep (stay with) the slowest cyclist. Assistance from the ride leader will be provided for flats and other minor mechanical problems.

EZ UNDER 10 MPH AVERAGE SPEED.

These rides are purely social. Expect shorter routes either in town or on

a trail and expect to ride together as a single group. No one will be dropped out of the back of the group. Assistance from the ride leader will be provided for flats and other minor mechanical problems.

GR GRAVEL. Route will be gravel, dirt or rough roads that are unsuitable for traditional road bikes.

MTB MOUNTAIN BIKE. Route will be on mountain bike trail system, typically singletrack.

NC NON-CYCLING EVENTS. No bikes required for these events.
