# **Springfield Earth Awareness Fair**

The Springfield Earth Awareness Fair with a decidedly "Bike Friendly" tone will be held in downtown Springfield on April 20. All residents are encouraged to "Be Green" and bike to the event which will be held from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Union Square Park, across from the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library &

Museum. For more information see Springfield's event page, https://www.springfield.il.us/Departments/ PublicWorks/EarthAwarenessFair.aspx.

As part of the bike friendly approach, the city will create temporary bike lanes on the south side of Madison Street (eastbound) and the north side of Jefferson Street (westbound) between 2nd St and 5th St, providing easy connection to the 2nd Street bike lanes. This will help provide a safe, comfortable and "green" route to the event.

In a further effort to encourage residents to try cycling downtown, the Springfield Bicycle Advisory Council (SBAC) will provide a bike valet service. Cyclists can leave their bikes in a secure location monitored by SBAC volunteers while they take in the exhibits, enjoy a snack from the food carts, or grab something from the last winter farmer's market at Union Station (it ends at noon.). All bike valet users will get a free safety light to keep them safe when they are riding, walking or running after dark (while supplies last).

The bike valet will be located in the northwest corner of Union Square Park grouped along with other active transportation agencies, including:

- SBAC, which will staff the bike valet, help riders plan bike routes with the Springfield Bike Map, and ask attendees to tell us: What would encourage you to bike more?
- The Springfield Bike Club, which will distribute information about the benefits of joining the club and promote our events.

- The Regional Planning Commission, which will promote its annual "Curb Your Car" commuter challenge to encourage biking, busing, or walking to work. This year's challenge runs from May 12-18.
- The Springfield Mass Transit District, which will encourage bikers to take advantage of the bike racks on the front of all their buses.

Interested in biking with a group? The SBC is organizing a ride from Washington Park to the fair. Not sure you can bike all the way downtown? Try a Park & Ride! Put your bike on/in your vehicle and drive to a safe parking area a little closer to the event. Then you can hop on your bike for a quicker, stress free ride.

For residents coming from west or south of downtown, Trish & Mary's Public House (located at 107 W Cook in the Vinegar Hill Mall) has generously offered Earth Awarenss Fair attendees the use of their parking lot as a secure Park & Ride location (park on the west side parking lot of Vinegar Hill Mall). This is a 5 min bike ride from the event location, a great option for newer riders and family rides. Don't forget to check out the bike quick fix station complete with pump and tools for those last-minute adjustments, located near the sidewalk.

If you're a regular rider, an occasional biker, or a newbie, consider cycling to the Earth Awareness Fair. Enjoy a fun ride with friends and family and show Springfield that bikes belong!

The SBAC meets at 4:30 p.m. on the second Monday of the month in the Public Works Conference Room in City Hall. Please join us to help make Springfield a better & safer place to bike.

Ride Leader Jennifer Walker and 5 others rode "Coast to Coast" in Florida with the Sunflower Tour organized by Bike Florida. Every year, Jennifer organizes a spring bike "girls trip" to a different area of the country. For Jennifer and Tabithah Marcacci, this was their 6th annual trip.

Our group has changed over the years, but no matter who goes, it is always fun! We've done the Florida Keys twice (Key Largo to Key West), The Chief Ladiga/Silver Comet Trail in Alabama/Georgia, the Tanglefoot trail in Tupelo Mississippi, Gulf Shores State Park Trails in Alabama and then this year, the Coast to Coast Trail which goes from Titusville, Florida to St. Petersburg.

Although Jennifer normally organizes and plans the full trip, this year she decided to plan the tour with BikeFlorida.org. They have 6-9 organized rides a year for cyclists to choose from and this one was great! For a fee, you get your hotels, transportation to the start, SAG support, and more. There were 55 women who registered, and around 42 finished.

The ages of women were from 31-80 years old. It was interesting to hear the cycling stories from women all over the country. What was the most eye-opening for me was that we realized how lucky we are to have such a great club in Springfield.

When we talked to others, they said that they didn't have nearly the amount of women in their clubs in other parts of the country. Jennifer encourages others to check out Bike Florida. #### What is it?

#### What is the cost to participate?

#### Sangamon Gravel Series (SGS)

#### What is it?

New for 2024, the SGS is the club's first organized gravel series. There are four group rides, and plans are in the works for a fifth ride that will be a race.

The series will have a competitive component, where each route will have several "bounty" segments. Points will be awarded to those who place on these segment efforts, and points will be tracked through the season. Prizes will be awarded to points leaders, and anyone who scores any points in the series will be eligible for random prizes.

#### What is the cost to participate?

At this time, there are no plans to charge a fee for the four group rides. There will be a nominal charge to enter the race at the end of the season.

#### Sangamon Cycling Series (SCS)

#### What is it?

2024 is the fourth year for this popular program, which caters to both beginning and experienced riders. The SCS is a series of four organized road rides held at various locations.

The club provides sag support and a rest stop with hydration and nutrition. There are various distances at each ride ranging from 20 miles up to 100 and routes are generally in loop format so that riders can "mix and match".

**Please read!** In the past the club has provided printed maps but this practice has been discontinued. The club tries to provide ride leaders at various paces, but this is not guaranteed and riders should be aware that the routes are not marked. GPS files are provided.

#### What is the cost to participate?

The cost for the 2024 program is \$30. SBC members will receive a code for a \$10 discount.

#### What is it?

In 2023, the SBC agreed to take over management of a youth triathlon from the Springfield Triathlon Club. This event was formerly known as the HSHS St. John's Children's Hospital / Scheels Kids Triathlon. With the addition of a third sponsor, Vistra, the name was shortened to the Springfield Kids Triathlon.

This will be the 11th year for this fun event targeted toward children ages 5-13. It's held at the Nelson Center in Lincoln Park on July 13.

#### When is the event?


The date is Saturday, July 13.

#### What is the Capital City Century?

The Capital City Century, or CCC, is a recreational road ride held annually in September. The 2024 event, to be held Saturday, September 14, marks the 52nd annual ride (2020 was a virtual event due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

Routes range from a 12-mile Family ride to the 100 mile "Century".

#### What's New for 2024?

- T-shirts are not included with registration but will be offered as an optional purchase. This decision was made in an effort to reduce waste and keep the cost of registration low. The club will purchase a supply of extra shirts that will be available for purchase at the Sherman Athletic Club.
- Chip timing will be provided by ItsRaceTime. While the CCC is not a race, we do acknowledge that there's a culture of friendly competition in some cycling circles. Chip timing will assist the organizers in tracking riders.
- An event jersey will be available for purchase. You may order the jersey early and have it shipped to you in time for the CCC. The club plans to purchase a limited supply of jerseys to sell at the Sherman Athletic Club. Orders will also be taken up to a week following the ride.
- All registered riders will receive a collectible embroidered patch. The first 250 riders to register will receive a pint glass.
- The 125-mile course will not be offered as a registration option due to the low turnout and extra

workload this creates for volunteers.

- The "groad" route will not be offered. With the new SGS, there are plenty of gravel options.
- Packet pickup will be held at the Sherman Athletic Club on Friday evening and Saturday morning. You can have a friend pick up your packet if you are unable to attend either time. Packets will not be held unless prior arrangements have been made.

# Have You Tried the **Geezer Ride?**

The Geezer Ride was established some time ago, possibly by former SBC President Alfred Arkley -- at least, Alfred was leading the ride at the time I started riding it. Alfred would

lead the ride from his home in the neighborhood just south of Washington Park, and the gang would head off in one direction or another. After Alfred moved out west, the starting location shifted to the Washington Park picnic pavilion, a central location with plenty of parking for those folks who want to drive. The idea of the Geezer Ride was to have a daily (M-F) meeting for retired geezers or other folks with daytime availability to meet up and go for a ride. It's a show-and-go ride, which means that whoever shows up decides where to go; the destination usually depends on the current wind direction, so that we can come home with a tail wind. From Washington Park, it is fairly easy to go south to the Interurban and Wabash Trails; east to the Lost Bridge Trail; north to the Sangamon Valley Trail; or west to Loami or New Berlin.

I am the current coordinator for the Geezer Ride. I can't make it every day -- even retired geezers have conflicts from time to time -- but I'll do my best to be there. If you want to contact me for more details, feel free.

# **Ride Classifications**

**18.1-20.0+ MPH AVERAGE SPEED**. These

rides are for extremely strong and competitive cyclists with expert bike handling skills. Expect cyclists to be self-sufficient, and able to maintain speeds of 19+ mph for extended distances using pace-lines and other faster riding skills.

**B** 16.1-18.0 MPH AVERAGE SPEED. These rides are for strong, experienced cyclists with considerable group riding experience. Expect the emphasis to be on improving individual stamina and riding skills. Cyclists will not feel obligated to wait for slower riders. Many times, pace-lines are common in group riding. Cyclists should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical repairs and should be comfortable navigating by map or GPS computer if separated from the group.

**C** 14.1-16.0 MPH AVERAGE SPEED. These rides are for competent cyclists with basic safety and bike handling skills. These rides combine social riding with improving fitness and riding ability. Expect that most cyclists will ride in groups. There may be rest stops on the route, but they will be limited. Cyclists should be comfortable navigating by map if separated from the group and should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical problems

#### **SLOW C** 12.1-14.0 MPH AVG

**SPEED.** These rides are for competent cyclists with basic safety and bike handling skills. These rides combine social riding with improving fitness and riding ability. Expect that most cyclists will ride in groups. There may be rest stops on the route, but they will be limited. Cyclists should be comfortable navigating by map if separated from the group and should be able to handle their own flats and other minor mechanical problems

#### D 10.0-12.0 MPH AVERAGE SPEED. These

rides are for novice or recreational cyclists. These rides will have rest stops as needed. Expect the ride leader or another club member to sweep (stay with) the slowest cyclist. Assistance from the ride leader will be provided for flats and other minor mechanical problems.

#### **EZ UNDER 10 MPH AVERAGE SPEED.** These

rides are purely social. Expect shorter routes either in town or on a trail and expect to ride together as a single group. No one will be dropped out of the back of the group. Assistance from the ride leader will be provided for flats and other minor mechanical problems.

**GR GRAVEL.** Route will be gravel, dirt or rough roads that are unsuitable for traditional road bikes.

**MTB MOUNTAIN BIKE.** Route will be on mountain bike trail system, typically singletrack.

NC NON-CYCLING EVENTS. No bikes required for these events.
